## POST Perishable Skills 2025 April 2025

### Course Description:

This 32-hour course is designed to meet the POST Perishable Skills requirements for Arrest & Control, Tactical Firearms, Strategic Communications and Driver Training/Awareness. The course includes First Aid/CPR AED Refresher and Use of Force. These **4 days**, when taken together satisfy the POST 2-year CPT training requirement and several legislative mandates.

**Equipment:** Gun belt, duty handgun, 3 handgun magazines, 200 rounds handgun ammo, handcuffs & handcuff key, protective ears, and eyeglasses.

**Attire:** Attire is relaxed: jeans (in good condition), or suitable utility-type clothing is acceptable. Shirts may not contain offensive language, logos, or otherwise be unprofessional. No shorts or open toe footwear.

**Note:** All courses provided at the Fresno Police Department Regional Training Center (FPDRTC) are open to the public with satisfactory completion of pre-requisites as indicated for each class. Courses offered to the general public at the FPDRTC meet Title 5 requirements under the California Code of Regulations. Courses may be cancelled due to low enrollment, or unforeseen circumstances, such as special operations or law enforcement emergencies.
